1. De "Linssen Collection"

All yachts in the Linssen Collection have been extremely well maintained and, if necessary, refitted and are therefore in excellent condition. Yachts from the Collection are supplied with a twelve-month yard warranty*.



2. Pre Owned jachten

Linssen pre-owned yachts are not more than ten years old and have been subjected to a thorough inspection. The engine (and generator, where appropriate) have been serviced. The yachts have also been professionally cleaned, polished and fitted with new antifouling and magnesium anodes. Because the yachts in the preowned section are owned by Linssen, we give them a three-month yard warranty*.

3. Brokerage yachts

Brokerage yachts get the same thorough inspection as the yachts from the pre-owned section. In this case, however, Linssen Yachts acts as a broker and we are not the yacht owner. We're selling the yacht on behalf of the owner.




RHENANIA, FROM 1973...

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BOOTE MAGAZINE BOATING TRAINING AT LINSSEN

The German publisher of Boote magazine, Delius Klasing Verlag, regularly organises boating training, boating lessons for navigation licences, etc. They do so at Linssen Yachts twice a year. On these occasions, Linssen and LBH partner Aqua Libra provide a number of yachts.

Early October, participants came to Maasbracht for a two-day training in 'port and lock manoeuvres'. Entirely corona-proof, at sufficient distance and with various additional measures, this was easily done on three Linssen yachts.



LINSSEN ADOPTS FIVE SEALS

In its newsletter at the end of July, Linssen Yachts promised to adopt a seal at ASeal in Stellendam for every yacht it would sell in August and September. We can now report that Linssen Yachts sold five yachts to private owners in those two months, which of course means that we will adopt five seals.

"This follows up on our spontaneous campaign last year (Linssen Magazine no. 55 of October 2019), as

part of which Linssen Yachts and Jonkers Yachts from Zeeland together adopted Sturdy the seal. During our boating holiday in our own country this year, we visited ASeal again and our children were so enthusiastic that we set up this campaign spontaneously," says Yvonne Linssen. "With the adoption we support ASeal in their important work in rescuing sick, injured, weakened and orphaned seals."

As soon as they arrive at ASeal, we will name the seals and follow their development and growth. The ultimate goal is to release them back into the North Sea.

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GRAND STURDY 500 SEDAN

We are working hard at developing a 'new 500'. This time it is a Sedan, and more particularly: the largest Sedan Linssen has ever built. Full of innovations yet retaining all important Linssen features.

Construction number 1 is already at an advanced stage and will be presented at BOOT Düsseldorf in January 2021.

Construction number 2 is also already in production in the engine room phase.

In addition to the external features with the unmistakable Linssen DNA, the 500 Sedan has the Linssen 'Slide and Pop Out Door' on both port and starboard, allowing you to easily, quickly and safely reach the gangways from the large saloon and steering pedestal to fasten the ropes during locking or mooring.

The Grand Sturdy 500 Sedan is constructed according to the latest standards and techniques and has the SPH hull shape.

In addition, the Grand Sturdy 450/480 and 500 AC Variotop®, as well as this 500 Sedan, have the **LIPPCON** (Linssen Integrated Power and Propulsion Configuration) for fully automatic control via the generator of all high-consumption equipment.

These are all technical highlights that ensure the most user-friendly operation possible, minimise malfunctions and help your maintenance engineer easily solve any malfunctions.

Modern yet enduring style

After introducing the Grand Sturdy 40.0 AC INTERO in our previous edition, it is now the turn of the Grand Sturdy 40.0 Sedan INTERO. The deft hand of KesselsGranger DesignWorks provided the sleek, new design of the Grand Sturdy 40.0 Sedan INTERO.

What immediately catches the eye is the large window in the saloon, which allows plenty of light into the interior. In addition, the functional 'Linssen Slide and Pop out door' has been added on the port side.

The larger portholes in the forward cabin also bring more light into the interior and blend in perfectly with the same aluminium style elements in the saloon.

Interior

You will be familiar with the interiors of our latest generation of yachts by now. The light cherry tones, which contrast beautifully with the leather upholstery of the furniture, together with the warm shades of the floor provide an ideal depth effect.

Slide and Pop Out door

The 'Linssen Slide and Pop out door' (LSP®) is located on the port side, next to the steering position. This ingenious door construction allows you to reach the cleats easily from the steering position and quickly fasten a rope in a lock or harbour, before manoeuvring into place at your leisure.

An integral part of this is the Linssen steering bench. Not only does it slide forwards and backwards for an optimal seating position in relation to the wheel, but it also slides from left to right for unhindered passage via a step - to the sliding door.

LINSSEN LONGTOP

The characteristic Linssen Longtop provides shelter and comfort in the large open cockpit. In summer, you are sheltered from the bright sun when you take a seat on the integrated cockpit bench. And when it gets dark in the harbour in the evening, you can turn on the atmospheric LED lighting and enjoy a glass of wine together.

If you enjoy sailing in the early and late season, you can attach the cockpit sails around the Longtop and cockpit, forming one large, heated living space. You can still quickly reach the ropes and cleats through the 'door' in the sail or you can quickly hang out the fenders.

The redesigned Linssen Longtop has an integrated water outlet, so that all rainwater is drained centrally and hardly any trickles down the windows. You have acres of space under the cockpit hatch for storing fenders, mooring lines, folding bicycles, cockpit sails and much more.

The swimming platform can be reached via the port side gate in the cockpit.

Developed based on technology

The engine room and all the technology and modules it contains are an integral part of the design process (see below for the TMM principle).

First and foremost there is the functional design. The full soft chine hull shape, the underwater hull including the free-hanging rudder construction and the deck design offer important advantages to you as an owner, such as:

- remarkably good (initial) stability;
- excellent rough water handling;
- manoeuvrability in general;
- a low freeboard;
- wide gangways;
- a rigid construction that nips vibrations and noise in the bud;
- minor differences in levels;
- large storage space under cockpit deck;
- robust rope fender around hull;
- maintenance-friendly access to all equipment;
- a carefully balanced engine room layout, so that the ship is correctly trimmed longitudinally and transversely, and the rearward trimming of the hull is negligible even at high revs;



- an orderly, spacious and well-organised engine room layout that provides good access to all components thanks to the TMM[®] (Ten Main Modules) principle;
- Two ICCESS® (Integrated CAN-bus Controlled Electric Supply System) control panels, which are centrally located in the living area and directly adjacent to the steering position.

Secondly, Linssen Yachts' integral quality policy leads to by far the best symbiosis in its segment and to far-reaching standardisation of component selection, in-house detail development and modular production processes.

Finally, the comfort and luxury of the interior design ensures that, on the one hand, the yachts are very easy to use and maintain and, on the other hand, they subtly distinguish themselves from the competition in ways such as:

- remarkably spacious compartments;
- a separate, spacious shower in all models;
- and therefore also separate toilet compartments;
- minor level differences (especially in the Sedan version);

- easy engine room access via a hinged hatch with a gas pressure spring;
- 'Easy Sleep Convert System' (2 extra beds);
- practical drawers and cupboards;
- a 'cellar';
- a stylish interior design thanks to the patented Linssen FPS[®] (Floating Panel System);
- a relaxed interior with kitchen, dinette, saloon sofa and side furniture on one level as far as possible;
- elegant shade frames in the interior;
- a neutral interior that suits modern or classic interior decoration;
- genuine leather upholstery;
- an original Corian kitchen worktop.



Several 30 and 35 SLs from the new Linssen SL series, which was only introduced in January at the Düsseldorf Boat Show, 19 SLs have already been sold. In addition, the first Linssen 40 SLs (Sedan and AC) are now also in production and the series is gradually becoming complete.

The design of the new series is particularly pleasing to the eye. The anthracite-coloured accents form the perfect backdrop for the contrasting stainless steel logos in the shape of a wing. These have an extra inlay in anthracite for the meticulously detailed Linssen SL logo.

Like the saloon windows, the portholes are masked with anthracite to visually reduce the number of individual shapes and increase the length of the yacht.

Unlike the Grand Sturdy series, the SLs have a robust, sleek PVC fender. The ascending lines at the bow accentuate the shape of the hull, resulting in a strong visual appeal with a sleek and slender appearance.

Linssen 40 SL Sedan and AC

Production of the Linssen 40 SL Sedan and AC is now in the finishing phase. The Logicam II production line has started with the engine room layout. In about 3.5 months they will be fully ready for introduction next year.

Just like the new Grand Sturdy 40.0 Sedan INTERO, the 40 SL Sedan will also feature the Linssen Slide and Pop out door (LSP®) on the port side next to the steering position.

Slagerij Wolfhagen butchers

Quality butcher with a sailing licence

Anyone familiar with our boat shows and other events will also be aware of the culinary attributes of Slagerij Wolfhagen butchers from Maasbracht. Previous visitors will have undoubtedly already sampled the most delicious dishes from this traditional butcher and caterer. Wolfhagen has been one of our regular suppliers since as far back as the 1980s. We joined Camiel Wolfhagen and his father Thijs for a chat in the canteen of the newly renovated butchery and kitchen.

Since 1980

Just like Linssen Yachts, Wolfhagen is a true family business. Thijs Wolfhagen and his wife Willie took over a small village butcher's shop on the Hoofdstraat in Maasbracht in 1980. Over the past 40 years, that business has grown into one of the most modern butcheries in Limburg (and perhaps even the Netherlands). Their son Camiel Wolfhagen, who trained as a chef and has Michelin-star restaurants such as Da Vinci and the Librije on his CV, has run the business since 2012 and became 100% owner this year.

At Wolfhagen, everything comes from their own butchery and kitchen. For example, fresh meat products are still prepared in the traditional way every day in their own sausage factory. However, the name Wolfhagen stands for more than just a quality butcher's shop. Together with his team, Camiel translates the knowledge and experience he gained as a chef into high-quality meals and other products. These are delivered daily in a catchment area stretching from Swalmen to Sittard-Geleen.

Maintaining quality

The company had its 40th anniversary this year. This was 'celebrated' with an extensive renovation of the butchery and kitchen. Everything was modernised and highly automated. Meals, sandwiches/rolls and meat products can be ordered from the new webshop (www.webshop.wolfhagen.nl). Camiel: "If you want to stay ahead, you have to keep innovating. In doing so, the most important thing is to maintain quality. Of course we want to grow but not too fast and never at the expense of the quality for which we have been known for years."

This urge to innovate is something that Camiel may have inherited. Thijs also made sweeping changes quite soon after taking over the butcher's shop. Thijs: "After just a few weeks, we started the first major renovation. After six weeks of hard work, we were able to open a completely new shop on 14 December 1980. In 1987 we started preparing and delivering meals and sandwiches. We had already been catering for some time by then."

Camiel is not the type to stand still (Thijs neither for that matter). In his mind, he is already working on the next ideas. A sneak preview: a new shop with partial self-service and a separate counter for picking up online orders.

Relationship with Linssen Yachts

At the beginning of the 1980s, Linssen Yachts was one of the first business customers to call upon Wolfhagen. Since then, Wolfhagen has been an integral part of the small and large meetings and events we organise for clients and employees. Thijs: "It has been my pleasure to do business with Linssen Yachts right from the start. Whether it's the christening of a yacht with 10 people, a barbecue for 50 people or a large buffet for the boat shows: they know what they can expect from us. A deal is always a deal for us too." "And everything is possible," Camiel adds. "The word 'no' does not exist for us. We always come up with a solution."

Thijs: "We also supplied the catering for the Linssen staff at the Düsseldorf Boat Show for almost 30 years. Unfortunately, we no longer do that. Otherwise, I would have been able to buy a new Linssen Grand Sturdy 500," he laughs. "Now it's 'only' a 470."

Under the yachting spell

A nice story is that Thijs Wolfhagen actually picked up the sailing bug from Linssen Yachts. He fell 'under the yachting spell' during a barbecue in 1993, as his wife Willie puts it so beautifully. After literally getting to know the ropes on their first small yacht, Thijs and Willie soon decided to go for a real Linssen. Thijs: "We had absolutely no experience with water sports. I had never even been on a yacht, let alone in a lock. In the first few years, we meandered around the Netherlands with the sailing rules on our lap. Later on, we got our sailing licences."

Mother's Day

Thijs bought his first yacht from Linssen for Mother's Day, because you can't get a better present as a mother. Their first Linssen, which Thijs chose in just five minutes, was a 35. Thijs: "Over the years, we have become real sailing enthusiasts. Sailing is just nice and relaxing. We enjoy making trips to Zeeland or Belgium. We used to take the children with us a lot, of course, and they always had loads of fun." Camiel has also started to love sailing. He still has a speedboat at the moment, but he hopes one day to follow in his parents footsteps. Camiel: "Becoming the owner of a Linssen, that's still a big wish of mine."

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From sail to motor

Motorboat sailing despite a partner with Alzheimer's

In November 2011, Bam and Vera van Gils-Gion, ordered a Linssen Grand Sturdy 30.9 AC in Maasbracht, after six months of searching. It had to be a motorboat, suitable for the retired seaman and his wife, also a sea sailor but with Alzheimer's disease.

So, why an AC? Bam: "Because both of us have always been used to being outdoors in all weather and the hood of the AC is easy to dismantle.

In 1972, we bought a teak Mulder cutter, which we sailed for 14 years along the Dutch, French, Belgian, German and Danish coasts. We sold the Mulder in 1986 to raise and educate the children. When the children left home, we started to get the itch again and bought a polyester Etap. We got enormous pleasure from that until Vera was diagnosed with dementia in 2002, which had been dormant for two years. The sailing still went reasonably well until 2011 but then Vera started to get scared when we were tacking. At the end of 2011, the decision was made and in consultation with Vera I started looking for a motorboat.

We sold the Etap when we ordered our Grand Sturdy and we had an offer from Linssen to rent a GS 9.9 AC in Capestang, in the Langue d'Oc region of the South of France. We sailed the Canal du Midi from Capestang to Carcassonne on this and back to Capestang via Béziers' six-lock system to bring the boat back. It was a wonderful experience to navigate the beautiful canal and taste all the wines of the Langue d'Oc region. The last bottles are still in the cellar, ready to bring back the memories once more. The trip lasted 14 days and we sailed about 300 kilometres.

After delivery of the ANNELYNNE II in 2013, we were planning to sail in the Netherlands, Belgium, northern France and western Germany. For a sea and open water sailor, a motor boat opens up a completely different world opens up with a motorboat. We started in Zeeland and sailed via the Zeeland waters, the Maas, the Maas-Waal Canal, the Waal, past Nijmegen (strong currents), the Pannerdense Kop, the Gelderse IJssel and Blokzijl to the Frisian lakes. On the way back, we sailed via the Randmeren and Muiden to the Vecht at max. 6 km/h. No faster because the Vecht region is much too beautiful for that. In addition, in beautifully warm weather and with a maximum height of 3.60 metres, Utrecht is a real experience with its many bridges. We continued on our route via the Hollandse IJssel, Gouda, Rotterdam, the Spui, the Haringvliet and the Volkerak to the Zeeland waters and the home port of Sint-Annaland. We were on the water for about three months and sailed roughly 1,000 kilometres. The following year -- 2014 - we sailed from Enkhuizen to Vlieland via the IJsselmeer with a group of Linssen yachts organised by Jonkers. Due to high winds, we had to go back to Leeuwarden, Groningen and via the Staande Mastroute to Stavoren, where the group was disbanded and we sailed back to Zeeland. This trip also took about three months and we covered another 1,000 kilometres.

In 2015, we left Sint-Annaland via Hansweert and the Westerschelde and sailed to Ghent with a stopover in Baesrode. We spent a few days in Ghent and Bruges and returned to Deinze via the Ghent-Bruges canal and the old Lys (very beautiful). The next morning, we set off to Kortrijk (nice mooring) via the Lys. We sailed along the old Bossuit-Kortrijk canal to Tournai (the passage under the centuries-old gate bridge is an experience). We stayed where we were overnight, and left the passage experience for the following day. It looked turbulent but it turned out to be very calm in retrospect. We left the next morning via the Walloon canals, Mons and Canal du Centre, where the old ship lifts were closed and the big new lift was an experience. We sailed through Charleroi and spent the night there. The next day, we continued on to Namur (beware of cross-stream mooring!) and stayed there for a couple of days. We sailed to Dinant and the following day to Chivez on the French border. I thought for a long time about whether I would cross the border in my situation. Repatriation from abroad is always complicated and often expensive. I decided to go back to Dinant and stayed there for a few days. We continued sailing along the Maas and visited all the major cities from Dinant to Willemstad. This trip also lasted about three months and we covered around 1,000 kilometres.

In 2016, we visited Sail Antwerp and the Belgian art cities. In 2017, it was the turn of Zeeland, West Brabant and the islands of South Holland, and in 2018 we went to Zeeland and Antwerp. In 2019, we took a trip organised by Linssen. We visited Antwerp and the Belgian art cities. There was too much wind, so we sailed to Willemstad via Terneuzen and Zierikzee. The trip was disbanded there and we went to Maasbracht and back to Zeeland via the Maas. The harbour concert in Gorinchem was an enjoyable one-week stopover. Once again, we were on the water for about three months and sailed 1,000 kilometres. In 2020, we don't yet have any plans, due to coronavirus, and we will probably stay in Zeeland. In the meantime, we have clocked up almost 10,000 kilometres and more than 1,000 engine hours. Although the boat is not particularly big, we have all the comforts we need and have spent many happy years together on board.

During the organised trips, I noticed that the skippers of various Linssen yachts had a sick or disabled spouse on board and were still making lengthy journeys across Europe. In such cases, the skipper is completely alone in terms of organisation, planning, provisions, maintenance, housekeeping and, above all, the care of their spouse or partner, which I particularly appreciate as someone in the same position. It is remarkable that they all have a maritime history just like me."

We are looking forward to the 2021 season and hope to spend as much time on board as we have in recent years.
